The Start Smart Workshop by Dr. Stephanie Quinn

On Thursday March 27, Rockford University, as part of its college / university partnership with AAUW, hosted a \$mart \$tart workshop on campus, from 5-8pm for students and others. Four AAUW representatives conducted the workshop, led by Susan Hoover, who directs the Illinois partnerships. A few local AAUW members attended.

The workshop consisted roughly of three parts. First some information on wage disparity was presented followed by the research that supports that finding. In the second part, aspects of interview and negotiation techniques were discussed. The third section paired an adult participant with a student for a mock salary and benefits negotiation.

Although the AAUW members and others in the audience were aware of these issues before the workshop, several of us learned much more about the availability of comparative information on job and career classifications: job seekers and salary negotiators can be informed about salaries and benefits instead of being passive recipients of offers.

The techniques section emphasized a balance between assertiveness and reality; when to start wage negotiations (only after there's an offer!); and how to discuss this delicate topic. The feedback from the mock negotiations was valuable because several students reported how awkward and uncomfortable it was, even in this mock environment, to ask for more and better in wages and benefits than was being offered. A response from the presenters was, yes, it is difficult, and that's why AAUW hosts such workshops.

It was a successful evening for those who attended, perhaps 25 in all, including presenters and adults. It remains to be seen if the University wishes to host another workshop next year, perhaps with greater student participation once the word gets out.

AAUW Public Policy On The Go by Faye Marcus

There's been lots of activity with Public Policy.

During the early part of March we collaborated with League of Women Voters to co-sponsor 3 candidate forums for school board candidates. There are contested races for school board in the Harlem, Belvidere, and Rockton school districts. There were excellent turnouts at each of these forums and we also received some good media coverage.

Why Equal Pay Day, what does it mean and how does it affect women? Some of us will be at the table to engage with the students. Would you like to help?
- APRIL 29-THE GENDER PAY GAP: Students and faculty at RU will host a panel discussion on the Gender Pay Gap. More information will be sent out as it becomes available.

You can see how important Public Policy is to AAUW. So let's all become AAUW Public Policy advocates!
