The committee met to develop criteria and guidelines for awarding two \$500.00 scholarships this year. We decided to focus on STEM areas of the curriculum since that is a national goal of AAUW.

STEM is science, technology, engineering and math. There is a concern that not enough girls choose to delve into these areas of the curriculum and therefore miss out on future opportunities.

Nationally and locally, AAUW wishes to encourage girls to get involved and to succeed in STEM. We have sent letters to all public and private high schools in Winnebago and Boone Counties. Girls may apply by going to our web site and accessing the criteria and entry forms there. The deadline is March 15 and the scholarships will be awarded to two deserving girls at our luncheon on May 19.
