PUBLIC POLICY by Faye Marcus

AAUW public policy is always making news. I have been appointed to the National Public Policy Committee. As part of this committee, I will help to determine the focus of our public policy agenda for National AAUW. Any of you who know me are aware that public policy is my passion. I am very excited to be part of this committee.

Here are some things that are happening. AAUW supports our state organizations by awarding Impact Grants. These are 2 year grants that allow state AAUW's to focus on certain issues. Eleven states were awarded grants and Illinois is one of them. In fact, Illinois was awarded 2 of the grants to focus on STEM and Pay Equity. Illinois and Missouri were awarded a cooperative grant focusing on ERA (Equal Rights Amendment). This amendment has not passed in several states-Illinois and Missouri being 2 of them.

During the past few weeks, I have taken part in 2 conference calls. One was with the state public policy chairs from Impact Grant states. The other was with Tina Chang, assistant to President Obama and Chief of Staff to Michelle Obama. Ms. Chang is also the Executive Director of the White House Council on Women and Girls. Secy of Health and Human Services, Kathleen Sibelius also joined us. It was really interesting to hear them speak about health care and how the Affordable Health Care Act will positively affect women's health care. For more information go to <u>www.healthcare.gov</u>.
