Every two years about 1,000 women AAUW leaders from across the country and Puerto Rico gather together to find new ways to empower ourselves and our communities. This year we came together in beautiful San Diego where the weather is always glorious.

AAUW's National Convention is a unique opportunity to learn new skills, gain insight, and connect with other amazing women.

We joined the wave in San Diego to learn about Leadership and what it takes to make a woman a leader.

How do we solve the equation of women and girls' underrepresentation in science, technology, engineering and math? (Support our branch STEM scholarship).

What can we do right now to help enforce TITLE IX and other laws that protect our rights?

Speakers and panel members at convention addressed these issues and more. The awardees of fellowships gave key leadership lessons that we ca bring back to our branches.

We had very full days-not much playing. We attended workshops, round table discussions at 7 a.m. and were able to consult with AAUW staff about many issues from social media to fundraising. We had fun with pre and post - convention tours and a great social action event at the beautiful library in San Diego. We attended a banquet and reception and a couple of happy hours.

## TITLE IX and AAUW's New Initiative by Faye Marcus

In 1972, TITLE IX was passed into law as part of the U.S. Education Amendments. TITLE IX states as follows: "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance".

AAUW was one of the main groups that advocated for the passage of TITLE IX; and we are still fighting to keep TITLE IX strong. Forty-three years later, TITLE IX's work is not done. Today, about 28 % of college women are targets of attempted or completed sexual assault; nearly half of students in grades 7-12 report facing sexual harassment; just 36 % of athletic operating dollars are spent on women's teams; and women and girls are still seriously underrepresented in STEM classes at all levels.

To correct these deficiencies, AAUW has instituted a new initiative and our branch is part of this project. TITLE IX requires that every school district has at least one employee who is responsible for coordinating the district's compliance with the law. That person is the TITLE IX Coordinator. The U.S. Department of Education has just released new resources to help these coordinators understand the full scope of their jobs

As Public Policy chair, I want to thank Christine Haeggquist, Wanda Hoover, Claire McIntyre, Becky Laible, and Dale Dunnigan for helping with this project. Each of us will be contacting specific school districts and providing them with these resources. These new resources emphasize something that AAUW members know well: TITLE IX is more than just athletics. TITLE IX coordinators should be monitoring the gender ratio in STEM courses, monitoring to end sexual harassment and violence in schools, and supporting pregnant and parenting students in middle, high schools and colleges.

However, not all school districts know about these resources. And that's where AAUW will help. We

are going to spread the word to schools in Winnebago, Boone, and Ogle counties.
