

The speaker will be Lilly Ledbetter, who in 1998, fought for equal pay all the way to the Supreme Court in a suit against Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company. She lost there because of the requirement that a suit be filed within 180 days of starting the job, even though she did not know about the discrimination then.

In 2009, Congress passed the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. Its aim is to loosen the timeliness requirements for the filing of discrimination suits. AAUW joined in the efforts as a lobbyist to pass the legislation.

ELECT HER

What is ELECT HER? And why are we so excited to be involved with this innovative program?

ELECT HER is the only program in the country that encourages and trains college women to run for student government and future political office off campus. It is a collaboration between AAUW and Running Start; ELECT HER addresses the need to expand the pipeline of women candidates and to decrease the political leadership gender gap. Nationally only 19 percent of all elected offices-federal, state, local-are held by women!

• What does an **ELECT HER** training look like?

ELECT HER is a one-day, 4-5 hour training. Campus administrators, students, and local AAUW members collaborate with AAUW and the Running Start organization to plan the trainings. I found out about ELECT HER at national AAUW convention last June. Donnette Tinsley, Director for Civic Engagement @ the Jane Addams Center at Rockford University applied for a grant to AAUW to host an ELECT HER training. And RU was awarded one of 50 grants, the only one in Illinois! Students from RU and other surrounding colleges and universities will be nominated by their professors and other students to attend this one-day workshop. Participants practice hands-on campaign skills, hear from inspiring local speakers, and discuss research on women in government. The planning committee including 2 students at RU, Donnette Tinsley and Faye Marcus have been working together along with phone help from Jessica Kelly, Program Manager-Campus Leadership Programs AAUW. We have been meeting regularly since the summer.

The training is divided into several segments and is facilitated by a trained facilitator who is sent here by AAUW. We will have 2 panels-a student panel composed of student representatives from RU and other invited colleges and a panel composed of local elected women officials. These women are: Jude Makulec-Board member RPS 205; Mary McNamara-Bernsten-Board member Winnebago County Forest Preserve; and Litesa Wallace-Illinois State Representative 67th district. A communications expert is also included as one of the segments; Mike Robinson-Communications Director for OSF St. Anthony Health System will help us in that portion.

Why Student Government?

Women make up a majority of the electorate, yet they have never been equally represented in the political sphere. AAUW believes that encouraging women to be involved in politics and being elected to an office while still a college student is the key to strengthening and increasing women's representation in government. In fact 56 percent of women in the current US Congress began their leadership careers in student government.

• 2015 ELECT HER by the numbers:

Over 1,000 students on 50 campuses attended an ELECT HER training in 2015. We anticipate that at least 50 students will attend our training.

76% of the 2015 participants who reported running for student office WON!

99% of those who participated in 2015 reported that they would recommend ELECT HER to a friend.

So now you know why we are so excited about this workshop! Of course this workshop costs money; we are being supported by our local AAUW branch, AAUW, Rockford University and AAUW-IL. As AAUW members you are invited to attend.

VOTER INFORMATION:

Voting is your right as a citizen of this country. The Primary Election in Illinois is March 15. Are you registered to vote? Have you moved? Changed your name? Then you must re-register if you haven't already. Do you know a young voter who has never voted? Please take her/him to register. There is a new law that allows 17 year olds to register and vote in the primary election if they will be 18 by the General election on November 8. The deadline for registering to be able to vote in the primary election is February 16.

IT'S MY VOTE: I WILL BE HEARD

AAUW has been the nation's leading voice promoting education and equity for women and girls since our founding in 1881. In 2012, AAUW launched the ACTION FUND IT'S MY VOTE: I WILL BE HEARD campaign. Through this campaign, AAUW members throughout the USA have registered thousands of millennial women at a time when young voters are less likely to vote.

AAUW is dedicated to making sure that every woman (and man) who is eligible to vote gets registered and then goes to the polls on election day and casts a ballot. We do NOT advocate for specific candidates, but we DO advocate for specific issues. From Congressional inaction on the Paycheck Fairness Act to frequent attacks on our reproductive rights, the current political climate seldom includes or responds to women's voices. To get real change, women must be part of the conversation. The most powerful way for our voices to be heard is at the poles.

AAUW's issues are spelled out on our website: www.aauw.org/publicpolicy. Among the important issues that AAUW advocates for are:

- **Civil Rights** including Equal Rights Amendment, federal judicial nominations, hate crime prevention, human trafficking, LGBT issues, reproductive rights
- Economic Security including pay equity, health care, social security, paid sick days, retirement security, work-life balance
- Education including STEM education, early childhood, higher education
- **TITLE IX** including equity in school athletics, sexual harassment and violence in schools and single sex education.

Do you want to know how our Congress people voted on specific issues? You can access that information for 13th Congress (2013) on the web site. Or call me-Faye Marcus. I have copies. The voting record provides information about Senators' and Representatives' sponsorships and votes on many of the above mentioned issues.

Once you are educated now go VOTE.
