

AAUW STEM SCHOLARSHIP AWARDEES FOR 2019

The AAUW STEM Scholarship Awardees for 2019 were introduced at the Annual Meeting and Luncheon in May. The Awardees shared insight and passion for their STEM majors by describing the spark that started their path and where they hope to contribute to the challenges of this world in the future. Here are some highlights of these talented future leaders in STEM careers.



Melis Dik is graduating from Auburn High School ranking first in her class of 299 students in the Gifted Academy. Melis was active at Auburn in many organizations including Key Club (President), Math Team, Model UN, and Scholastic Bowl (Captain). She also volunteered over 600 hours in many community organizations. Melis is going to study Biochemical Science at Johns Hopkins University where she hopes to eventually serve an organization akin to Doctors without Borders.

Alison Lawrence is graduating from Hononegah High School as a Scholar Athlete being in the top 3 of her class of 490 students. Alison was active in many school groups including Cross Country, Track & Field, Student Council and National Youth Leadership Summit. She has volunteered on many trips including Tanzania where she found her passion at the Plaster House surgery. Alison will be studying Pre-Medicine at Augustana College.





Hsing-Yng "Winnie" Louh is graduating from Hononegah High School at the top of her class of 490 students with perfect national testing scores. Winnie was active in school and community activities including Class President all four years, Math Team Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering, and Tennis. Winnie is also a percussionist for the Rockford Symphony Youth Orchestra. Winnie will be studying Statistics at Rice University.

Alicia Repka is graduating from Hononegah High School in the top three of her class of 490 as a National Merit Finalist, and NIC-10 Scholar Athlete. Alicia was active in many school organizations including Cross Country, Math Team (President), Materials Science Engineering Camp (U of I) and Stanford Pre-Collegiate Engineering Program. Alicia will study Biomedical Engineering at Washington University where she will prepare to design prosthetics and implants.

WORK SMART

In April Rockford Branch members attended the AAUW Illinois State Conference. There we learned that the Coca Cola Company had donated \$500,000 to AAUW for the purpose of providing access to women across the US to AAUW's online Work Smart program. In return for that donation, AAUW is expected to engage 100,000 women in Work Smart.

To help meet that goal, I presented the online Work Smart Program at April's Rockford Housing Authority meeting, where I am the Board Chair. I provided the website information to Director of the Job Readiness Programs and asked that she review it for the women enrolled from RHA in her programs. She went online and was so impressed that she has now removed the previous negotiation skills component to replace it with AAUW's Work Smart Program. The classes are called Liferforce Development and Bridges Over Poverty. Those programs are well-respected throughout the country and RHA will be receiving an award for those classes in Boston in July 2019. Imagine, the classes are already nationally recognized and are now going to be made even better with the assistance of AAUW! I thank Coca Cola, AAUW, and the Rockford Housing Authority for helping move low-income women in Rockford forward in their quest for self-sufficiency and independence.

The website is salary.aauw.org. It is available to both men and women and can be used to learn the art of negotiating, not just for salaries but for any area – like buying a car – where negotiating skills give someone a better chance of achieving their goal.
