






BRANCH CELEBRATES 90TH ANNIVERSARY WITH BIRTHDAY BASH

The AAUW Rockford Area Branch will celebrate 90 years with a luncheon on Saturday, Sept. 21 at Franchesco's Ristorante, 7128 Spring Creek Rd., from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Ninety years of fashion and the important women who championed issues important to AAUW's mission in each decade will be featured in a show called "AAUW Rockford Branch through the Decades – 1929 to 2019". Women featured will include one of the founders of the Rockford Branch, Mildred Berry, Rockford College (University) professor in the 1930s; Eleanor Roosevelt in the 1940s, best known for her 1948 charter of liberties, "The Universal Declaration of Human Rights"; the Rockford Peaches and the players of the AAGPBL in the 1950s who paved the way for Title IX by virtue of their professional baseball careers; Betty Freidan, co-founder of the National Organization of Women (NOW) in the 1960s; Gloria Steinem, co-founder of Ms. and New York magazines in the 1970s, who began Take Our Daughters to Work Day; U.S. Representative Patsy Mink who co-sponsored Title IX legislation in the 1980s; Mae Jemison, physician and first African American woman to travel into space in the 1990s; Lilly Ledbetter who fought to close the gap between women's and men's wages in the 2000s. The 2010s representative is a tightly held secret and will only be revealed at the luncheon.

Emcee for the luncheon will be Judge Rosemary Collins. Judge Collins will also speak to "Women in Leadership".

PUBLIC POLICY – FAYE MARCUS

AAUW supports the civil and human rights of all immigrants, including a fair and just path to legal status. This statement shows our public policy regarding immigrants and refugees. This includes those coming to our Southern borders seeking asylum.

I hope many of you were able to attend presentations by Linda Zuba and David Black regarding their horrifying experiences on the Texas border and in Tijuana, Mexico. AAUW Rockford was a sponsor of the Lights for Liberty event on July 12. Linda will be speaking to AAUW in November. More information will follow.

Here are some ways to help Asylum Seekers, Refugees, At Risk Immigrants, Unaccompanied Minors, and the Reunification of Families.

- Stay informed and share accurate information
- Speak out against injustices and spread the word about ways to help
- Contact your Senator and Congressperson. The D.C. switchboard is 202-224-3121.
- Here are some things to tell them: Stop separating families; reunite families; inspect detention centers and holding cells for human rights violations; improve detention conditions; close the detention centers and release children and adults to their families or sponsors that live in the USA. Use family case management or other alternatives to detention. Urge passage of Comprehensive Immigration Reform. Address the root causes of the reasons for the mass exodus from Central American countries: Pass the Central American Reform and Enforcement Act.
- Write a letter to the editor.

July 19, 2019

This week, I spoke at the inaugural in-person meeting of the Employers for Pay Equity. Consortium about the legislative trends in pay equity. This presentation was an outgrowth of earlier work I did with employers who had come together several years ago to sign the White House Equal Pay Pledge. The Consortium brings together employers who believe that by implementing new processes and policies businesses can play a critical role in eliminating the gender pay gap and can help provide workers an equal opportunity to advance in the workplace. Increasingly, employers are finding that equal pay and related workplace protections can make companies stronger and help deliver positive economic impact. To finally close the pay gap, a broad and diverse chorus of voices, including supportive and committed employer voices, is a critical part of the equation. AAUW looks forward to working with employers as they continuously improve their policies and practices to help women succeed.
