FAYE MARCUS NOMINATED FOR AGENT OF CHANGE AWARD

This year the Rockford Area Branch Board chose to nominate Faye Marcus for the 2020 State Agent of Change Award. We want to share the nomination with the membership.

Award Criteria:

This prestigious award emphasizes promotion of AAUW's mission and purpose and will be awarded to a member who has served as a catalyst to bring about positive societal change and visibility to AAUW. Nominees should be outstanding models who have actively promoted change in the areas of education, equity, advocacy, philanthropy, and/or public policy. The successful nominee's actions should have resulted in increased visibility for AAUW. The nominee's accomplishments should show direct involvement with the member's branch and/or other AAUW national initiatives. This award emphasizes promotion of AAUW's mission and purpose and will be awarded to a member who has served as a catalyst to bring about positive societal change and visibility to AAUW. (Nominations may come from individual members or branch boards. There is no longer a 'during the last year' requirement for accomplishments. Branches may re-submit previously nominated individuals. Current AAUW board members may be nominated.)

2020 NOMINATION FORM – AAUW-IL AGENT OF CHANGE AWARD

QUESTIONS:

1. For what activities and/or accomplishments is this nominee being recommended? (Please be concise and specific.)

Faye has been actively involved in our Branch for many years, serving in many positions and as president two times.

She has brought her leadership skills to bear most effectively in the role of Public Policy Chair, having served on both the State and National Public Policy Committees. She hosts a monthly Branch public policy interest group meeting, writes articles for our quarterly newsletter encouraging members to get involved in contacting legislators to support AAUW's positions, plans an Equal Pay Day program with Rockford University, meets with local and state legislators to explain AAUW's positions on various topics, writes letters to the editor regarding voting rights and serves on the program committee, making sure at least one program focuses on a public policy issue.

In this suffrage centennial year, Faye wrote a Rockford Register Star editorial focusing on the history of AAUW. She represents AAUW on the Women's Suffrage Centennial 2020 collaboration of women's and civic groups. The coalition will celebrate area women's suffrage

accomplishments with monthly editorials and educational opportunities and lectures. It will culminate in the dedication of a public, community-build sculpture.

She is an active member of League of Women Voters, Women's March, YWCA, the Rockford Peace Coalition, Womanspace, Eliminate Racism 815, and Temple Beth-El and fosters collaboration between these groups and AAUW. She represents our Branch on the Illinois Fair Tax Referendum Coalition, has worked on the Everyone Counts campaign to make sure everyone is counted in the 2020 Census, was an active participant in planning a Work Smart program in Rockford, is a voter registrar and coordinated a Get Out The Vote event, candidate forums and candidate Meet and Greets.

In February 2018, she led the Branch to adopt a resolution that AAUW supports the new Family Peace Center and, with other Branch representatives, presented it to the City Council.

In 2019, Faye represented AAUW in a community group that brings information to people about the current immigration issues. She then organized a Branch program about immigration justice.

Her passion for public policy and how these issues affect everyone shines in every meeting. She is an inspiration to us all on many levels: professional, community commitment and personal life. We value her many contributions and would love to see her be recognized for her lifelong support of AAUW and her faithful and tenacious service to the community.
