Illinois bills will affect women

The "Let's Talk Public Policy" group has met to discuss two important bills that AAUW-IL is supporting. They are: Repeal the Parental Notification Act (HB1797/ SB2190), Illinois Healthy Youth Act/REACH Act (HB1736/SB647). Parental Notification of Abortion (PNA) is a very harmful and unnecessary law that puts young women in danger and interferes with their access to time sensitive health care. Please go to www.repealpna.org for more information.(See more information on page 6.) The REACH Act (Responsible Education for Adolescent and Childhood Health Act) will require that all schools teach

comprehensive appropriate personal health and safety education K-12. This includes public charter schools. You can google REACH ACT for more information.

By the time you read this Initiative, the Public Policy group will have met via zoom with our local state representatives to discuss these important bills and other AAUW public policy priorities. More information will come your way in AAUW NEWS. (See related story on page 6.)

Illinois Bill Proposals Will Affect Women

The Illinois legislature is considering twoseveral bills that could make changes in women's status and in the education of our children. They are:

Parental Notice of Abortion (PNA) SB 2190 and HB 1797

The harmful PNA is the last roadblock to making Illinois 100% pro-choice.

We need to trust youth with their healthcare decisions, and pass the repeal of PNA.

Responsible Education for Adolescent and Children's Health Act (REACH) HB 1736 and IL Healthy Youth Act (IL HYA) SB 266 & HB 3071

Both the REACH Act and IL HYA are to update the personal health and safety education in all grades to make sure they are

inclusive, comprehensive, medically accurate and age appropriate.

REACH Act is a mandate; IL HYA is a guideline. Same end goal, different strategies to get the bill passed. Currently legislators want the bills to merge to get it passed.

Family and Medical Leave Insurance Act SB 835

The Family and Medical Leave Insurance Act creates a state-run insurance program that allows Illinois workers to use 26 weeks of job-protected leave a year.

• To welcome a new child into the home

- To maintain a healthy pregnancy
- For their own family member's illness
- For reasons related to domestic or sexual violence
- For reasons related to military The Naperville Branch is putting

on a program on May 15 on the importance of paid family leave. Hear from distinguished panelists, watch Zero Weeks documentary and understand the pending state legislation.

Ensuring Success in Schools Law (ESSL) HB 3223

ESSL would guarantee that K-12 students who are survivors of gender-based violence, teen parents, or expectant parents can stay in school, stay safe, and complete their education. The law would:

• Allow excused absences related to their circumstances

• Ensure one staff member is trained to help advocate for students and connect them to resources

• Create confidentiality protocols to keep students safe.
